LETTER FROM THE EDITOR:

Dear Members,

We had a marvelous time at our annual meeting in October even though our attendance was small. Sorry so many of you could not be with us. I hope you will plan to be with us in 1984. The 1984 meeting is set for October 20th and 21st which is the third weekend in October.

On Saturday, October 15th, we held an all-day workshop at the Century Inn. We spent the day sharing notes and digging into some of the information we have in the Strickland Library.

We greatly appreciate those people who shared their experiences and advice with us on Saturday. Freeman Strickland led us in a "round robin" discussion of the how, what, when, where and why of surveying cemeteries. I think all of us gained a few ideas from this discussion. Joel Dixon Wells, who prints Strickland Scene for us and is the owner/publisher of Armchair Publications, gave us advice on how to publish genealogical material and what to expect from printers in your own locale. One of the highlights of the day was Imogene Bowen's demonstration of how to use a strip film projector as a microfilm reader. This "set-up" is available for approximately one-fourth the cost of a microfilm reader. If you are interested in knowing more about this, I am certain Imogene will be glad to give you the details (479 Karen Drive, Alpharetta, GA 30201).

Our luncheon and general meeting was on Sunday at Century Inn. Our speaker was Jane Adams, an archivist from the Georgia Department of Archives and History in Atlanta. Jane has taught history for a number of years, and has been with the Georgia Archives for twelve years. We thoroughly enjoyed her lecture about the availability of records in the Georgia Archives, and were particularly interested in her discussion of the somewhat obscure but very important group of records known as "File 2."

During the Sunday meeting, several suggestions were made as to possible projects for 1984. One suggestion was to form a committee to study the possibility of obtaining access to genealogical material gathered by lawyers during the 1939 Texas Oil Suit better known to all of us as The Wilson Strickland Oil Controversy. Even though we might be "opening a can of worms" and even though we do not intend to (as an organiza-

tion) pursue the possibility of reopening that court case, much valuable information was gathered during that time which is no longer available to researchers, because it has been retained as evidence in the case. Much of the information sent to the attorneys was not really pertinent to the case, but would be of utmost value to researchers today. We would like to obtain this information and preserve it for future generations. If you are interested in discussing and exploring the possibilities, please contact EDRA S. A second project for 1984 is to form a committee to concentrate on the early Stricklands of Maryland and Virginia. THE ROANOKE MYSTERY

The disappearance of "The Lost Colony" from Roanoke Island (off the coast of present-day North Carolina) in the late 16th century has long been a baffling mystery. We do not know what form of disaster overtook the more than one hundred souls of that misadventure. There have been many theories advanced as to their fate. Three prevailing theories are outlined as follows:

I. The colonists all died from some disaster while still on Roanoke Island between the time they were last seen in August of 1587 and the time the island was revisited by John White in August of 1590. The disaster could have been disease, starvation, hurricane, drowning, or massacre by hostile Indians. No evidence has ever come to light supporting any of these situations.

II. The colonists all left Roanoke Island of their own volition to re-establish themselves on the mainland. Soon after their arrival on the mainland, they were captured by hostile Indians and held captive for a long period of time. Eventually, most, if not all, were killed by their captors. There is some slight evidence to support this theory.

III. The colonists all left Roanoke Island with the assistance of Manteo and his very small band of Hatteras Indians. They made their way down the sand banks of the eastern shore to Manteo's home village of Croatan. The Hatteras were very adept at canoeing in the choppy coastal waters and the colonists were known to possess small boats of their own. Under threat from hostile tribes on the mainland, Manteo, his entire village of perhaps less than thirty people, and all the colonists decided to migrate even further southward down the outer banks. Once they felt a safe distance had been reached, they returned to the mainland and traveled inland to a point well away from the eastern shore.

It is this third theory that correlates well with the tradition of a particular group of Anglo-Indians in North Carolina. An ancient tradition of the Indians of Robeson County, North Carolina, more recently named the Lumbee Tribe, is that they descend from the English survivors of Roanoke, racially mixed with their Hatteras Indian rescuers.

The Lumbees are, indeed, a mixed breed of Caucasian and Indian; and, it is well documented that they have been so for hundreds of years. The Lumbees, as far back as they can trace and in accordance with all their traditions, have never spoken any

form of Indian language, never called themselves by Indian names, nor have ever lived in a tribal manner during their recorded three hundred plus years in the area where they now dwell.

When the first European settlers started pushing into the area that is now Robeson County, they found the light tan Indians here were speaking English; not the contemporary English of the early 1700's, but rather a dialect identified as a much older form of English. This becomes even more interesting when we consider the first European settlers into this area were not English but were Scottish and French Huguenots. There are historical reports of individual explorers, predating the French and Scots, indicating a group of unusual Indians were in this same area as early as 1660 "speaking the British tongue."

Among the Lumbee, living today in Robeson County, North Carolina, are several Strickland families; all related and all Lumbee. It is my belief that this branch of Stricklands originated in the mid to late 1700's when several northeastern North Carolina Strickland families migrated to this area and settled along Drowning Creek in what was then Bladen County. The headwaters of this stream are still today called Drowning Creek, but most of it was renamed the Lumber River from which came the name Lumbee. This is precisely the area where the ancestors of the Lumbee dwelled. It is easy to see how at least one Strickland son, or maybe more, chose a girl of Indian heritage to be his bride; and how, subsequently, their children may have lived in closer association with their Indian heritage.

It is not for me to prove or disprove this intriguing Lumbee tradition. If it is true, we have trampled over a real gemstone of American history. As late as January, 1983, a dedicated group of searchers waded through mainland swamps near Roanoke Island looking for an unusual stone formation that had been reported, belatedly, by someone that had sighted it many years ago. They did not find it --- this time.

Freeman Strickland of China Grove, North Carolina, is the newly-elected President of Strickland Research, Inc. and will serve in this capacity for 1984 and 1985. "John Martindell was born in England, 8 mo. 24, 1676, and was an early settler in Bucks county. He married Mary Bridgman, daughter of Walter and Blanch (Constable) Bridgman, 'both of Neshaminah in the County of Bucks,' who were married at the house of Stephen Sands, 6 mo. 26, 1686.

"John and Mary (Bridgman) Martindell, were the parents of six children of whom John, born 6 mo. 22, 1719, married 2 mo. 9, 1746, Mary STRICKLAND, and had twelve children..."

"Edwin Warren Martindell, a man of rare literary attainments, and a well known educator of Hulmeville, Bucks county, traces his ancestry to John Martindell, who was born in England, August 24, 1676, and who was united in marriage to Mary Bridgmont. Among their children was a son John, who married MARY STRICKLAND, and among their children was a son Miles, who in 1780 was united in marriage to Susannah Harvey..."
