LETTERS FROM THE FILES OF VIRGINIA STRICKLAND ROBERTS

In the late 1930's and early 1940's, Virginia Roberts (then Virginia Strickland) corresponded with many people to compile information on the various Strickland lines. Virginia, 1984-1985 Secretary of Strickland Research, has graciously donated many of these letters to our library. The following are from this file:

Princeton, NC  
Feb. 12, 1938

Dear Miss Strickland,

The answer to your reply. My grandparents came from Mississippi and also my Father. And he was 86 years of age when he died, his name was Levi Strickland and my grandfather was Benjamon and I had an uncle that started in Mississippi and his name was Jimmie Strickland. My name is J. B. Strickland, age 67, has been married twice and my first wife had one child, H. L. Strickland, age 46. And he has a son named J. B. Strickland. Little J. B., age 22. My last wife Mrs. Ophelia Strickland now living has 7 living children, Jessie Elzana, Levi, Louvenia, Willie, Mary Elizabeth, Laban and Clabon. Clabon 7 year old. Laban 9. Mary Elizabeth 11. Willie 15. Louvenia 17. Levi 19. Elzana 21. And I a farmer operating 2 plantations, have been a study user of SCOCO fertilizer. I am changeing this year to Smith Douglass for tobacco. My wife has related in Georgia, was born in Georgia and her post office was Daisy, Ga. where we visit from twice or three times a year.

P.S. I had three brother and three sister. Only one sister living, has no ancestor from neither brother or sister. My grandfather died at 105 year 4 month and 20 days.

Dear Miss Strickland,

I will answer your card I rec'd last week. My grandfather Ben Strickland was a full blooded irishman. My grandmother Vic Strickland born 1792. She was an American. Levi Strickland, my father, and Jim Strickland (uncle) of Mississippi. He had three daughters, Ann, Bashay and Nancy Strickland, all dead. My grandparents moved from Mississippi to North Carolina in covered carts in the year of 1838. Uncle Jim went back to Mississippi when he was a young man. My father has been dead 21 years, died at the age of 88. I had two brothers that has been dead, William S. 36 years and Daivid S. 6 years. William was 37 years old when he died. Daivid was 70 years old when he died. I have one sister living, 63 years old, an old maid. This is all I know about my back ancestors.

One of my Gr Gr Aunts is still living. She is almost 100. Henry Co. and Dallas Co., Mo have many of my Strickland family. We are from Webster Co., Mo. Our 2nd Henry had 20 children. I'll give you my line as Uncle Frank gave it to me. Hope I can find our missing link,

REVOLUTIONARY PENSION FILE OF DAVID STRICKLAND  
CONNECTICUT CONTINENTAL TROOPS

File No. S35084

David Strickland enlisted in Litchfield, Connecticut, in July, 1775, and served five months in Captain Nathaniel Tuttle's Company, Colonel Charles Webb's Connecticut Regiment. He re-enlisted and served for one year in the same company and regiment. In February, 1777, he enlisted in Captain Warner's Company, Colonel Samuel Wyllys' Connecticut Regiment, and was transferred to Captain \_\_\_ Company, Colonel R. J. Meigs' Connecticut Regiment and served three years in all. He enlisted sometime in 1781 and for one year served as 1st Sergeant in Captain Nathanel Edwards Company in a Connecticut Battalion, and again enlisted in 1782, serving as 1st Sergeant in Captain Jabez Fitch's Connecticut Company, and continued in service until the close of the war. He was in the battles of White Plains, Scots Plain and Stony Point.

David Strickland was allowed a pension beginning in 1819. He was sixty years of age and a resident of Wayne County, Missouri Territory. In 1823, he was residing in Miller County, Arkansas.

*(Editor's Note: Most of David Strickland's file is illegible - whether due to bad microfilming or faded originals, I do not know. Most of the above information is from a typed letter in the file written to Rev. George S. Sutton of Kansas, dated June 28, 1934, in reference to a request for Revolutionary records of David Sutton, John Sutton, David Gardner, Joseph Rogers and David Strickland.)*

PLEASANT GROVE PRIMITIVE BAPTIST CHURCH, COLQUITT COUNTY, GEORGIA

This cemetery is located on the Adele Road east of Moultrie, GA. Most of the Stricklands buried here are related and many of the collateral families are here also. This research helped me further identify some of my folks. (1) I was looking for 'Frank' Strickland and found he is Miles Franklin Strickland. (2) James E. is Elbert J. (3) Mrs. Mary Byrd is Mary Scarborough. (4) 17 are children and grandchildren of Stephen S. Strickland. Stephen S. Strickland's first wife was Harriet Maria McClelland. Her grave is in a very small private cemetery and her tombstone is the only one standing: "Hearit Mariah, Born 1829, Died June 1872." Stephen Elias Strickland's first wife, Senith Barnes, is in a small cemetery in the middle of farm land in Brooks County, GA. There are 65 graves in this small cemetery; 2 are Stricklands: "Mrs. Senith Strickland, 1860-1900" (my grandmother); & "Hester Strickland, wife of J. B. McCoy, 1862-1900." I call this the Gornto Cemetery, because they once owned this large farm that now belongs to a Folsom family. Stephen Elias Strickland lived in the vicinity and was related to Folsoms, Edmondsons and Gorntos. My father was born in this area. -Margaret Major.
