EDITOR'S LETTER


Dear Members,

1st & 2d VOLUMES OF FAMILY GROUP SHEETS AVAILABLE - CHARTS FOR v.3 BEING COMPILED

The first two volumes of Strickland family group charts are now available from Strickland Research, Inc. member David N. Strickland. BOOK AVAILABLE ABOUT DESCENDANTS OF JOHN HOLLY WILLIAMS (1767 NC- MS)
& HIS WIFE RHODA STRICKLAND (1780 NC- MS)

A book of interest to Strickland researchers, The Williams Family in Lawrence County, Covington County, Lincoln County, Covich County, Mississippi with Allied Families of Jordan, Boyington, and Bridges, by Mary E. Williams Sandel and Elias W. Sandel, Sr., was reviewed in the November-December 1989 issue of The Genealogical Helper. The review states: "John Holly Williams was born in 1767 and his wife Rhoda Strickland was born in 1780, both in North Carolina. They settled in Mississippi and had a large homestead farm between Prentiss and Columbia in what was then Marion County, Mississippi." The book is described as "a collection of documents, newspaper clippings, excerpts from history books, and family memories It contains an incredible amount of information, almost all in the form of documentation, and leaves no doubt about the authenticity of any of the information."

The book is soft cover, 199 pages, indexed, with maps and photographs. It is available for \$22.00 postpaid from the authors at 309 E. Chestnut Street, Amite LA 70422.

[The Genealogical Helper is published by The Everton Publishers, Inc., POB 368, Logan UT 848321. The subscription rate is \$21.00 for 6 bimonthly issues. This is a "hefty" publication - the November/December 1989 issue, for example, was 259 pages in length.]

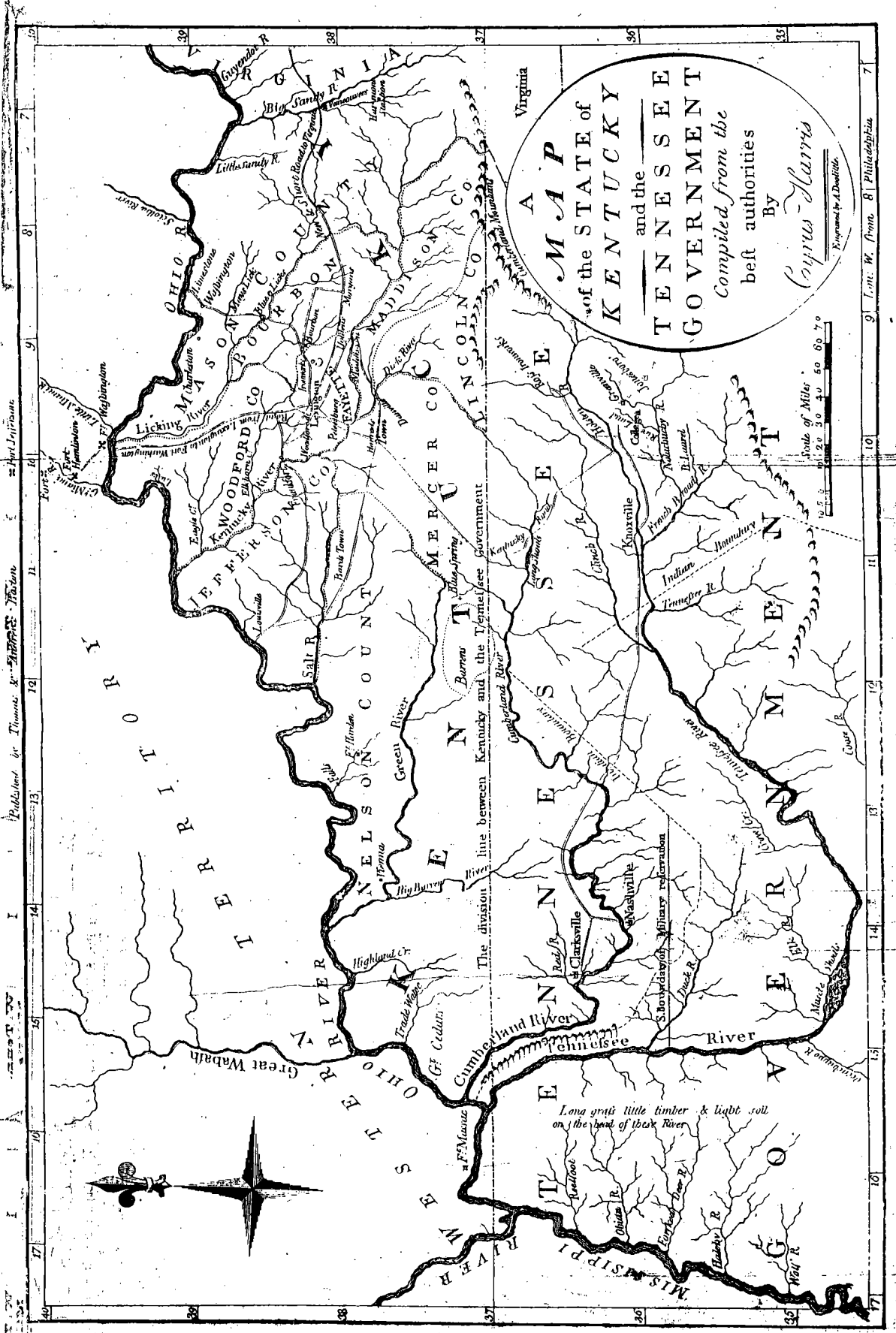

There is a brief article on BIRD S. HURT and his family in Jill K. Garrett's War of 1812 Soldiers of Maury County, Tennessee, in which it was noted that he settled first in Columbia, Maury County, and then near Rally Hill, in eastern Maury County near the Marshall County line. He died in 1836 in Maury County. The same reference notes that SAMUEL STRICKLIN of Maury County drew a pension until 1832 for his service (which pension record I have not been able to locate - RCS).

STRICKLANDS, "near STRICKLANDS" and related possibly connected parties noted in Ms. Garrett's Maury County, Tennessee Will Books A, B, C-1, D & E, 1807-1832 (Southern Historical Press) include:

THOMAS STREPLIN's 1818 rental from the estate of John ASKEW; GIDEON STRICKLAND as purchaser at the 9 December 1814 sale of property of Wm. HAWKINS, dec'd.; a note from SAMUEL STRICKLIN, SR. among the 13 January 1821 inventory of the estate of Uzzell HAWKINS; SAMUEL STRICKLIN & David GILLASPIE listed in the 1821 account book of Isaac B. HARDIN, dec'd.; SAMUEL STRICKLAND, SAMUEL STRICTLAND and CAMPBELL STRICKLAND on an 1822 ± list of accounts of men deemed solvent; SAMUEL STRICKLIN as buyer at a 21 November 1818 sale of Hugh MAIRS, dec'd., naming A. CATHEY as one of two settling the estate [a SAMUEL STRICKLAND was a witness in an 1828 Rutherford County, Tennessee suit ISOM v. CATHEY (or vice versa) involving a mill pond on CATHEY land where SAMUEL then resided at age 71(?) - RCS]; David GILLASPIE, Bird S. HURT and Eli ASKEW as buyers at sale of Benj. CALLOHAN, dec'd. (undated 1824 ±); and SAMUEL STRICKLAND listed alongside WILLIAM STRICKLIN on an unalphabetized list of accounts with the estate of John P. POOL, dec'd., on 23 July 1824.

**WAR OF 1812 MILITARY RECORD OF
SAMUEL STRICKLAND OF TENNESSEE PLUS
OTHER MAURY COUNTY, TENNESSEE DATA**

The military record of War of 1812 veteran SAMUEL STRICKLAND, also known as SAMUEL STRICKLIN, consists of the four cards shown here. SAMUEL served from 13 November 1814 to 13 May 1815 as a sergeant in Captain BIRD S. HURT's Company of Infantry, in Colonel METCALFE's 1st Regiment of West Tennessee Militia, under the command of General CARROLL. He was present with the company at a 19 November 1814 muster roll at Camp Hynes, and with the company at Nashville when mustered out on 13 May 1815.

DATA FROM THE PENSION AND BOUNTY LAND WARRANT APPLICATION FILES OF
HARMON STRICKLAND (-1838) AND NANCY McBRIDE STRICKLAND (ca. 1803 -)

Harmon Strickland (or Stricklin, as his name more often was spelled) married Nancy McBride on 4 Jan 1824 at the home of Nathaniel McBride in Franklin Co TN, with Elisha Floyd, J.P., presiding.

A faded and only partially legible leaf from their family bible provided the birthdates of their children: Frances Caroline(?), b. 28 Oct 1824; Martha Judy(?), b. 7 Apr(?) 1826; George Nathaniel, b. 8 Dec 1828; Cloe Ann Elizabeth, b. 15 Apr 1831; Benjamin Preston, b. 7 Apr 1833; Mary Jane, b. 3 May 1835(?); and Edney, b. 28 Feb 1838. These entries were reported to have been in the handwriting of James Bell "of Tennessee". A copy of only one side of the above leaf, with entries through the name of Benjamin Preston, is in the copy of the pension file received from the National Archives; the later dates are as cited in Veterans Administration correspondence from the period 1939-40, copies of which are a part of these National Archive files.

Harmon volunteered 15 Oct 1837 at Hockerville (Hawkinville?) TN for six months service in the "Florida war with the U.S. and Hostile Seminole Indians" from 31 Oct 1837 as a private in Captain Benjamin Cherry's company of the battalion of Tennessee Mounted Volunteers commanded by Major William Lauderdale. Harmon died 25 Jan 1838 in service at Pickelattie FL of fever from disease contracted in line of duty. Captain Cherry later described Harmon as an able bodied and stout man up to the time of incurring the fatal disease.

On 7 Nov 1851 Nancy Stricklin, then a resident of Tishomingo Co MS, appeared in Franklin Co TN to file a bounty land claim, giving her age as 48 years. Captain Cherry and Jonathan Thomas, residents "of Grundy and Franklin Counties", were witnesses re Harmon's service, Cherry as his commander, and Thomas as having waited on Harmon (presumably at his sickbed) and as having seen him buried "with the honors of war".

On the same date Joseph Bradshaw stated in Franklin Co TN that he was present when Harmon and Nancy were married, and that he knew them until Harmon's death. Also on that date William G. Guinn of the same county certified that he had known Harmon and Nancy for many years, and that their date of marriage was found by him recorded in the family bible as 4 Jan 1824.

In August 1854 Nancy applied for a pension from Tishomingo Co MS, stating her age as 49 years. On 20 Dec 1854 Benjamin Cherry gave his age as 64 years, and residence as Franklin Co TN; the postmaster gave Cherry's post office address as Hawkinville.

On 12 Aug 1854 Bethany Fox of Tishomingo Co MS, age 55, stated that she had known Harmon and Nancy before their marriage and was present at their marriage.

On 14 Aug 1854 Lucretia McBride of Tishomingo Co MS, age 48 years, stated that she had become acquainted with Harmon and Nancy in Franklin Co TN three years before their marriage, that she was present at their marriage, and waited on Nancy when the marriage was solemnized. On 14 Dec 1854 Lucretia McBride and George N. Stricklin, also a resident of Tishomingo Co MS, stated on oath that they were personally acquainted with Nancy and Harmon Stricklin since their (i.e., Nancy's and Harmon's) marriage, and that she, Nancy, had remained a widow, unremarried since Harmon's death. This "proof of widowhood" was witnessed by Noble L. Gross and Benjamin F. McDaniel (or McDonald).

On 21 Apr 1855 Nancy gave her age as 52 years in an affidavit in her Tishomingo Co MS county of residence. She stated that she obtained warrant No. 39,094 for 80 acres under the Act of 28 Sep 1850. This declaration was witnessed by J. B. Milton and J. D. Christopher.

On 21 Jan 1856 J. J. Winters and W. J. N. Milton of Tishomingo Co MS declared that they then lived "in a short distance of Nancy Strickland", and that she was then an unremarried widow.

In the bounty land warrant application file is a letter written 23 Jan 1860 by Benjamin Palmer of Cascade, Dubuque Co IA, to the Commissioner of Pensions expressing concern that "a Caveat has been filed by you to arrest the issue of Patent for 80 acres in return for Duplicate Certificate of location of Warrant No. 23962 Act of 1855." He had stated he had bought the warrant. It was not clear why the patent of the land was withheld.

In 1939-1940 Mrs. O. S. Spain of Spain's Wholesale Grocery on South Filmore Street in Corinth MS, Mrs. G. B. Grisham of Corinth, George W. Stricklin of Iuka MS, and Mrs. Sallie Strother Hollingsworth of Edgefield SC wrote to the Veterans Administration inquiring about Harmon (apparently in at least some cases seeking a connection with Wilson Strickland). Their relationships to Harmon and Nancy were not stated in their inquiries to the Veterans Administration.

The above data was drawn from Bounty Land Warrant Application File No. 23962-80-55 in the name of Harmon Strickland, and "Old War Widow File 9681" (pension) in the name of Harmon Stricklin, from the National Archives.

MINOR 1893 REFERENCE TO DOCTOR S. D. STRICKLAND OF MORGAN COUNTY, ALABAMA

In the Morgan Co AL Death Records, Book A 1893-1895, Part 3, there is mention of Doctor S. D. Strickland as the reporting physician regarding the death of Mary Adkins, a black female, single, age 24, b. AL, d. 10 Aug 1893 Decatur AL ("Infl. Bowels"), bur. Beat 13.

This item is from records copied by Dene Walls & Sue Marine published in Valley Leaves v. 24 no. 2 (Dec 1989), the quarterly of the Tennessee Valley Genealogical Society, POB 1568, Huntsville AL 35807-0568.

RADAR LEAVES GRAVES IN PEACE

Using ground-penetrating radar (GPR), employees of the Soil Conservation Service have confirmed the extent of a Native American burial ground on the banks of the Mississquoi River in northern Vermont. The state now plans to purchase the site and protect it.

GPR works by sending electromagnetic waves into the ground. By the way they are reflected, these waves can indicate anomalies or subsurface features different from the surrounding soil material. As a portable GPR unit is pulled across the ground, its findings are recorded on graph paper. The equipment is most sensitive within a depth of about 10 feet and in dry, sandy soils.

SCS, a leader in the application of GPR technology, has four units that it uses to improve the quality of its soil surveys and to locate bedrock, voids, and sinkholes at potential construction sites. The agency has also used its GPR units to help locate archaeological relicts without disturbing them.

The Vermont site containing the burial ground, on the outskirts of the community of Highgate, was purchased by the Vermont Nature Conservancy from a developer who had been denied a permit to build on the land. SCS was then asked to suggest ways to stabilize the severely eroded river bank to protect the burial ground.

"It was a really steep bank," said Gregg Schellentrager, assistant State soil scientist for SCS in Vermont, who coordinated the GPR survey of the 2-acre site. "The Nature Conservancy knew there were graves in the area, but wanted to know if the bank could be sloped back without damaging them. Our GPR investigation indicated that this could not be done, so we are developing an alternative plan. This plan involves the placement of gabions to protect the bank and possibly a retaining wall at the base of the slopes to prevent further erosion."

The burial ground is thought to have been used by the Abenaki Indians up to about the year 1600. Once it obtains adequate funding, the State Division of Historic Preservation plans to buy the land and protect it not only from erosion but also from looters who have been in the area looking for artifacts.

Homer St. Francis, current chief of the Abenakis, was on hand for the GPR survey and said he was opposed to any excavation. "They should rest in peace," he said.

Schellentrager said this was not the first time SCS has used GPR in a search for human remains. A GPR unit was used in Alabama to locate a Confederate cemetery and in Florida to search for the body of a murder victim.

"You can't actually 'see' a body with the GPR," Schellentrager said. "You do, however, see something that is different from the surrounding soil material and may be worth investigating."

TIPS FOR WILSON STRICKLAND RESEARCHERS

In Texas we laugh each time someone tries to find the lineage of Wilson Strickland. If one wishes to research:

1. Order a land-grant map of the county from the Texas State Library, State Archives and Library Building, POB 12927, Austin TX 78711. Then study his neighbors. Did any come from North Carolina? The library may have a cross-file on Wilson.

2. Texas tax records from 1836 exist on film from the library.

3. The Catholic Church made church censuses. Everyone was required to support the church. The census is called the Black Census. There are three rolls. Try the State Library.

4. Gambles Laws is a set of books about early land grants. These books may be at the State Library.

5. Texas also has a set of land title books that cover the certificates and grants. One's friends had to sign for the certificates to be legal.

Some researchers think Wilson's father was Noah Geraldus Strickland. They say Bolin, Edward Dey, Wilson, Noah S. and William Dew were brothers. Noah S. came to MS 1830, 1850 LA, and 1860 TX. William Dew was in LA.
