| Pettigrew, Brig. Gen. James J. | 7-4-1828 | 7-17-1863 | Brig. Gen. of the Confederate Army; son of Ebenezer & Ann B. Pettigrew At. Bunker Hill [the residence of A.P. Boyd] near Martinsburg Va., from wounds received near Falling Water on the Potomac River while acting with his command as rear guard to General Lee's Army of Northern Virginia. |
| Pettigrew, James | 1-29-1822 | 10-27-1835 | Was drowned in the Atlantic from on board the Ship Waverly while on a voyage from New York to Mobile for his health. |
| Pettigrew, John Shepard | 8-29-1820 | 7-21-1821 | Son of Ebenezer & Ann B. Pettigrew |
| Pettigrew, Henry Ebenezer | 9-23-1824 | 12-3-1831 | Son of Ebenezer & Ann B. Pettigrew |
| Pettigrew, N. N. Blount | 11-16-1795 | 7-1-1830 | Wife of Ebenezer Pettigrew daughter of William Shepard of New Bern; Mother |
| Pettigrew, William | 7-21-1817 | | Date of death defaced and faded Son of Ebenezer & Ann B. Pettigrew |
| Shepard, Ann Blount | 6-30-1830 | 1-13-1861 | Dau. of Ebenezer & Ann Blount Shepard Pettigrew; wife of Rev. McKay, D.D. |
